Our air conditioning was installed on July 20th, and we're approaching the half way mark in our fundraising. Please pray for this effort, consider donating and spread the word.



Sprit, fill me with the prayer Jesus is praying so I can follow and agree.

That wasn't the only thing they were walking away with. There were some really big smiles from both kids and parents. UBC showed God cares and so do we.
