A lot of times we hear things then do the same thing this gentlenman did. Instead of changing our will and testament, we change what we're willing and not willing to do. The question is what and who are we listening to? Are we hearing things that are beneficial to us or are we hearing a bunch of noise? This month we're going to talk about "Noise Cancellation."

I've been praying for God to strengthen my faith this season. Seems the greatest challenge for me is to receive God's love and mercy. In a culture of self-sufficiency, I can forget it's all about Jesus too easily.

Traveling outside of my familiar helps. It's humbling to be in a foreign country without a map to navigate. It's what Christ asks of us when he says, "follow me." We are called to be childlike.

When I received the invitation to go on a mission trip to serve the congregation of Woodstock Baptist Church, along with the people of Cape Town, South Africa, I didn't know what would be asked of me, I only believed that through my prayers, God had an answer for me.

Before we left for Cape Town we were told, "Don't just give food to people. Eat

with them." Spiritual healing requires relief work (feeding the body) and release work (feeding the soul) because God is relational. By way of giving from the heart, we receive God's blessings.
